Gospel Reading

Luke 5:4-10

When [Jesus] had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch.'

Simon answered, 'Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets.'

When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So, they signaled to their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And, they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink.

But, when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, 'Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!' For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon.
