I pray for joyous blessings for you in the coming year.


I pray that you receive all of the gifts that God has for you,

This year has been busy, with grant -writing and installation of solar panels and new windows in the daycare wing, among many accomplishments.

In 2024, we welcomed new members to the Council, including Gail Tronstad as treasurer, Gus Byrom as coordinator for Outreach and Social Justice, and Jeanne Wolfe, secretary. We appreciate their new perspectives and hard work. At this point,



all members of the Council are willing to be nominated to continue in their present positions.

Critical to operating within our budget this year was volunteer work for cleaning and lawn care. I am especially grateful to Kathe Simons and her team and to Ed Fields and his lawnmower. Everyone agrees that they have kept our building and grounds in better shape than "hired hands," saving members about \$12,000 this last year. They have graciously volunteered to continue this service. We all must take some responsibility to care for "our" home of worship and fellowship.

Many more helpers have made 2024 successful. Every Sunday, our disciple groups greet us, hand out bulletins, and pass the offering plates; and serve communion monthly. Pat Buell organizes the groups and runs the slides. The Drysdales, with grandson Rhys, stream the service online. We've come to expect a pastor's message that speaks to us personally and music that's delightful. In the office, Alane Dallas ensures that donations are banked, bills are paid, and all manner of building and activity details get done.

Together, we will have a fulfilling and spirit-filled New Year!

Prepared for the Plymouth Women's Fellowship Group Christmas Brunch. This recipe was served and it was DELISH! A perfect "hot" dessert for the chilly days of winter. ENJOY!

HOT CURRIED FRUIT

3/4 cup brown sugar

1/2 cup butter

4 tsp. curry

3-15 oz. cans drained fruit (which can include pineapple slices, pear halves, peach halves, apricots, pitted prunes or cherries for color).

Drain canned fruit of your choice. Melt butter, add brown sugar and curry, stirring to blend. Pour mixture over fruit, cover and cook slowly at 325 degrees for 40 minutes. Baste occasionally. Let flavor marry 25 hours before serving. When ready to serve, bake in slow oven for 1/2 hour. Especially good with ham or chicken. Serves 6-8.


